# D. Exceptional standard

Evidence demonstrates that T has planned well and used the learning outcomes to adapt and tailor activities to the context.

Relevant lead-in/warmer to topic in which T draws directly on learner's knowledge and experience to enable them to set their own learning outcomes.

Instructions are clear, concise and understood by learners who always know what they are expected to do. ICQs and demonstrations are used appropriately.

The T moves around and observes and listens to all learners, interjecting as appropriate to keep them on task, facilitate learning and encourage equal participation.

T gathers feedback from a variety of learners avoiding repetition by encouraging them to listen and add rather than repeat what has been said. T also encourages learners to engage in open debate and fills in knowledge gaps using own experience.

T participants actively all the time and works very well in a group, valuing all members and encouraging them to participate and contribute equally helping to generate a constructive working environment.

## REPORT

Andhra Pradesh Higher Education Communication Skills Project (Pilot Project) was taken up by the APSCHE in association with British Council in the AY 2016-2017. The Teacher Training programme has been designed by the British Council and it aims to equip teachers with the required facilitation skills that will help them deliver the Learner Course effectively to the students.

The Teacher Training programme (10 days, 2 blocks of 5 days each) will be delivered in sessions that are 1.5 hours each. Each day will have four sessions with two 15 minute breaks and an hour for lunch.

The course focuses on introducing communicative teaching strategies and methods, learner-centred techniques such as elicitation, collaborative learning activities that develop speaking, reading and writing skills of learners. Furthermore, participants will understand the benefits of conducting classes solely in English and will become familiar with the Learner Course materials. In order to ensure a high standard of the Teacher Training Programme, APSCHE selected Master Trainers according to a rigorous process involving English proficiency level assessment, motivation and pedagogical awareness. Suitable candidates received 12-day training from British Council Trainers on the Andhra Pradesh Higher Education Communication Skills Project so that teacher training sessions are as successful as possible.

Active participation is a key characteristic of this training and participants were expected to work in groups and pairs and to actively discuss and share ideas from their experience throughout the course. Andhra Pradesh Higher Education English Communication Skills in collaboration with British Council has initiated this project.

The training of Master Trainers took place in 2 blocks of 6 days each. The details are mentioned below:

\*Block 1\*: 15th May to 20th May, 2017 (SPMVV Tirupati)

\*Block 2\*: 29th May to 3rd June 2017 (Acharya Nagarjuna University, Guntur)

Following the training, the Master Trainers delivered the training to 2,500 teachers in the month of June and July 2017.

As per this policy, Dr.V.B.Chithra, the selected Master Trainer, cascaded the training to the faculty in two colleges, one in SITAMS College, Chittoor during 10-14 July 2017 & 24-28 July 2017 (10 days) and the other one at JNTUA CE, Pulivendula from 16-8-2017 to 25-08-2017 (10 days)
